

Writing Retreat and Workshop

The point of this writing retreat is to bring together a small group of philosophers and theologians, both faculty and graduate students, to interact around the theme of 'Divine Freedom'. Faculty participants will circulate a work in progress prior to the retreat so that time at the conference can focus on intensive discussion of the papers. Graduate student participants will be responsible for short initial comments on two or three of the papers to open the sessions, and will be responsible for moderating those sessions. Faculty participants will be expected to then revise their contributions in light of the workshop and submit it for publication in an appropriate venue within one year of the workshop. Graduate student participants will be expected to begin work on their own projects on divine freedom in light of their participation in the workshop.

Travel expenses, as well as lodging and meals, will be paid for participants. Each participant will also receive a stipend.

Faculty applicants are required to submit a no more than two page description of their proposed project and a CV. Graduate student applications are required to submit a no more than two page description of their interest in divine freedom and a CV. Applications should be submitted via email to ktimpe@nnu.edu by 1 Dec 2011. Participants will be notified by 15 Dec 2011.
